Stewarding the AFGC these last two years was one of the highest honors I've ever had. Thank you for the trust you had in me and all the support all of you have given me. I couldn't have done it without every member of the

AFGC helping me at every step of the way. We got a lot done these past two years. Scholarships from the AFGC, SCR and NGC were given every year to deserving Arkansas young people just starting their future careers. After having eight Flower Show School courses, Arkansas now has 10 student judges and 6 new Accredited Judges. And clubs, you have really stepped up. There has been at least one flower show in Arkansas every month, with approximately 75% of the clubs participating either by volunteering, submitting horticulture or a design or sending a donation. (Those ribbons are expensive!) This was the first statewide flower show since before Covid. The theme was "A Painted Garden" and it was beautiful. If you missed it, please don't miss the next one. As a student judge myself, I really appreciate those judging opportunities. We have a new Blue Star marker in Bentonville. The installation ceremony was canceled because of a tornado but the marker is there and we are pleased that we have once again been able to honor Arkansas veterans. We also started the first NGC Garden School in Arkansas. The third course will be in Marion, Arkansas September 12 and 13 with the last course being held in September of 2026. All of these were state projects. They don't include the club projects all over the state. The clubs in Arkansas are all working hard to beautify their communities, improve the environment and educate their friends and neighbors.



PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE AFGC GARDEN CLUB MANUAL BY-LAWS

The following By-law changes were approved at the April 29th Executive Committee Meeting and had a first reading at the April 30th Board Meeting. They will be presented for a 2nd reading at the August 7 Mid-year Board meeting for a vote:

CURRENT PROPOSED PURPOSE

1. Article VIII. Finances. Section 4. One-half (1/2) of the Life Member's fee shall be placed in the Scholarship Fund

shall be placed in the Scholarship Fund and one-half (1/2) in the Federation General (operating) Fund.

2. Article IX. Funds/Investments Trustee Committee. Section 4.A. Scholarship Fund

A. One-half (1/2) of the Life Member's fee shall be placed in the Scholarship Fund.

- 3. Article X Dues. Section 1. -Dues
- **A.** Annual dues for club members shall be six dollars (\$6.00); this includes state dues of five dollars (\$5.00) and one dollar (\$1.00) for National Garden Club dues. State dues shall include a subscription to the official magazine, *The Arkansas Gardener.* (Ratified April 18, 2017)
- **C.** Persons holding membership in more than one club shall pay six dollars (\$6.00) for state and national dues into each club. (Ratified April 18, 2017)

1. Article VIII. Finances. Section 4.
All monies received from Arkansas Life
Members be placed in the Scholarship.

Members be placed in the Scholarship Fund.

2. Article IX. Funds/Investments Trustee Committee. Section 4.A. Scholarship Fund

A. All monies received from Arkansas Life Members be placed in the Scholarship Fund.

- 3. Article X Dues. Section 1. Dues
- **A.** Annual Dues for club members be eight dollars (\$8.00); this includes state dues of seven dollars (\$7.00) and one dollar (\$1.00) for National Garden Club dues. (Ratified August 2022) Section 1. Line C: Persons holding membership in more than one club shall pay eight dollars (\$8.00) for state and national dues into each club.
- **C.** Persons holding membership in more than one club shall pay eight dollars (\$8.00) for state and national dues into each club.

- 1. To simplify bookkeeping and donations, as well as prioritize Scholarship funding as an organizational priority.
- 2. Updated to match re-wording in Article VIII.
- 3.

A. Updated to reflect current dues as changed in August 2022. Delete subscription to Arkansas Gardener as it is digital only and publicly available on AFGC Website.

C. Match changes in Section 1. A.

STANDING RULES ADOPTED AT APRIL 30th STATE CONVENTION. Standing Rules below were changed and adopted by approval of the Executive Committee

1. Pg 25. Book of Remembrance

This book may be used as a way of remembering the deceased or to honor friends and members of our clubs. With a contribution of at **least twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)**, a person's name is placed in the Book of Remembrance.

2. Pg 25. Circle of Roses.

A thirty-dollar (\$30.00) donation should be sent to the Circle of Roses Chairman by an individual or club. Submit a short biography stating when person became a garden club member along with a photo to be published in *The Arkansas Gardener*.

- 3. **Pg. 26. Finances**. Currently: A sum of \$300 is allowed for the Office Manager to be used to attend the State and District meetings. <u>Adopted to read</u>: The AFGC Office Manager will be compensated for full registration and transportation to the annual convention and mid-year board meeting.
- 4. **Pg. 29. Life Memberships- Arkansas.** Currently: The fee for a State Life Member is \$50 and serves a two-fold purpose. One-half of each membership fee goes into the Scholarship Fund helping to further the education of deserving students who are interested in horticulture, conservation, or allied subjects. The

- 3. As part of her duties the AFGC Office Manager is required to attend both State-level meetings, and should be compensated.


